Qualifications:

- University You could study for a degree in a subject like: zoology, animal ecology, animal behaviour, conservation, marine biology or environmental biology. You'll need a relevant postgraduate qualification like a masters degree or PhD for some jobs, particularly in research.
- Entry requirements 2 or 3 A levels, or equivalent, including biology for a degree and a degree in a relevant subject for postgraduate study

Working hours: 38 to 40 hours a week

Salary: Average salary starts at £18,000 and can raise up to £48,000

Key Terminology



Traineeship = A traineeship is a course with work experience that prepares young people for work or an apprenticeship. It can last up to 6 months. Eligibility is for those aged 16-24, who are unemployed and have little or no work experience.
