Digital Copywriter

Digital copywriters understand their audience and engage them through persuasive and accurate writing. As a digital copywriter you'll produce the written content for webpages, either working in an employed position or as a freelancer. Your job will be to engage the reader and motivate them to do something, such as buy a product or service.

Qualifications:

- √ 4-5 GCSE's at grades 9-4 including English and Maths
- ✓ An essay-based degree, such as History or English
- Having a qualification in marketing, journalism or creative writing can be helpful, but isn't necessary


Working hours: Most copywriters work Monday to Friday, although weekend and evening work can be necessary, especially for projects with tight deadlines.

Salary: Starting salaries are between £22,000 and £30,000 per year. Three or more years' experience can expect to earn £25,000 to £40,000 per year. For senior copywriters and heads of copy, the salary figure is between £45,000 and £80,000.

Key Terminology

GCSE – General Certificate of Secondary Education - A GCSE is an academic qualification in a particular subject, taken by 14 to 16-year-olds. They are highly valued by schools, colleges and employers.

Advanced level qualifications (known as A levels) are subject-based

qualifications that can lead to university, further study, training, or work. You can normally study three or more A levels over two years. They're usually assessed by a series of examinations.

The most important criteria for choosing A levels subjects are:

- Looking at what you are likely to enjoy and be good at. If you enjoy a subject or have an ability in it already, you are more likely to do well.
- Are there any particular subjects and/or grades you may need? If you have a particular career, job, or further study in mind, you may need to choose specific A levels in order to meet entry requirements.
- How open you want to keep your future study and career choices?

Dental Nurse Apprenticeship

Dental nurses work in a clinical environment that could be located in a NHS general dental practice, hospital, private dental practice, specialist dental practice, community dental service or military dental clinic. The clinical environment is called a dental surgery and consists of a dental chair, x-ray unit and various equipment and instruments required for dentistry. As an apprentice, you will predominately work with a dentist, dental hygienist, dental therapist, clinical dental technician or orthodontic therapist within a surgery environment with patients attending throughout the day. The broad purpose of the occupation is to provide chair side support to all dental professionals and ensure high standards of cleanliness and infection control. Dental nurses prepare instruments, materials and medicaments for dental procedures, mix materials, sterilise instruments, keep records, note dictation, carry out stock control and ensure patient comfort and safety throughout their visit.
