Job of the week

Rural surveyor

Rural surveyors value farms and areas of land, plan how land is used and advise clients.



Qualifications:

- ✓ University You'll usually need a degree or postgraduate qualification that is accredited by the Royal Institution of Chartered Surveyors or approved by the Central Association of Agricultural Valuers. There's no specific degree subject you need to become a rural surveyor. However, some relevant subjects include: geographic information science/rural estate and land management/land use and environmental management/rural business management/surveying.
- ✓ Graduate training scheme You could get a postgraduate qualification through a graduate trainee scheme. You'll usually need: 2 to 3 A levels, or equivalent, for a degree/a degree in any subject for a postgraduate course.
- ✓ Apprenticeship You could do a surveying degree apprenticeship. You can find out more about surveying apprenticeships from the Royal Institution of Chartered Surveyors. You'll usually need: 4 or 5 GCSEs at grades 9 to 4 (A* to C) and A levels, or equivalent, for a higher or degree apprenticeship
- ✓ Other Routes You could start as a trainee rural surveyor. You can find opportunities through organisations like the National Trust. If you're already working for a surveying company, you could get a graduate diploma in surveying from the University College of Estate Management.

Working hours: Typical hours 38 to 40 hours a week. You could work evenings/weekends attending events or appointments.

Salary: Average salary (a year) £22,000 as a starter to £43,000 experienced.


