Job of the week

Care Worker

Care workers help vulnerable people manage their daily activities and live as independently as possible.



Qualifications:

- ✓ College A college course may help you when you look for work. You could take a: Level 1 Certificate in Health and Social Care/Level 2 Diploma in Care/T Level in Health. You'll usually need: 2 or fewer GCSEs at grades 3 to 1 (D to G), or equivalent, for a level 1 course/2 or more GCSEs at grades 9 to 3 (A* to D), or equivalent, for a level 2 course/4 or 5 GCSEs at grades 9 to 4 (A* to C), or equivalent, including English and maths for a T level.
- ✓ Apprenticeship You could become a care worker by doing an adult care worker intermediate apprenticeship or a lead adult care worker advanced apprenticeship. There are no set entry requirements but it may help you to get in if you have: some GCSEs, usually including English and maths, or equivalent, for an intermediate apprenticeship/5 GCSEs at grades 9 to 4 (A* to C), or equivalent, including English and maths, for an advanced apprenticeship.
- ✓ Volunteering You could volunteer with an organisation that supports vulnerable people, such as a care home, charity, hospital or hospice. You can find volunteering opportunities from Do It and the National Council of Volunteering Organisations (NCVO)
- ✓ Direct Application You could apply directly and train on the job. You'll find it useful to have experience of working with people. Some employers may expect you to have GCSEs in English and maths at grades 9 to 4 (A* to C) or equivalent.

Working hours: 35 to 40 hours a week

Salary: Average salary (a year) £14,000 for a new starter to £25,000 for an experienced carer.

Young Professional Training= a free personal development programme for all 14-24 year olds in the UK. Young people register and, on successful completion of their initial training, can identify themselves as Young Professionals.
