### TRIPS WEEK 2019

Students were recently involved in a wide range of trips as part of our trips week. The week kicked off with Years 8 and 9 spending the day at the Bowes Museum, where they took part in a series of workshops including making sculptures of facial features and programming Lego cars.

The annual Belgium and France World War One battle fields tour also took place during trips week. Students from Year 9 visited landmarks across the Western Front including the Tyne Cot memorial, Langemark cemeteries and preserved trenches in Sanctuary Wood. The students also visited Wellington Quarry under Arras, where soldiers had built a network of tunnels and an underground hospital one hundred years ago. This hospital is specifically mentioned in their GCSE specification focussing on injuries and treatment on the Western Front. Being able to walk along the corridors of the actual places these events took place really brought this aspect of their course to life.

There were also two further trips to France for Year 7 students and a mix of Year 8, 9 and 10 students. The Year 7's trip to Albert involved practising their French skills whilst visiting lots of exciting places such as Montdidier, an aquarium, a chocolate factory, a cathedral in Amiens and Parc Astérix. During the trip the students took part in a photography competition and took some fantastic photos of their time in France.

The Year 8, 9 and 10 trip to France was based in

Dordogne where the 41 students took part in an array of activities including a visit to a monkey forest and canoeing. They also had the chance to visit many landmarks and locations like Gouffre de Padirac, Rocamadour, Autoire's waterfall, Turenne's castle and Collonges-la-Rouge. They managed to escape the 29 degree heat while they took a mile-long trip inside a cave where the water was a refreshing 11 degrees.

Back at school, Nidderdale Moorland Group visited to talk to the children about wildlife, moorland conservation and controlled heather burning. They also brought in a selection of game meats for the children to try, which they loved!

The PE department also had a fantastic trips week with the outdoor pursuits club visiting beautiful Swaledale to find fossils and build a dam. They moved on to exploring Hamsterley Forest and putting their leadership skills to the test during some water-based activities before finishing off their trip abseiling, climbing and coasteering. PE also took a trip to the Velodrome in Middlesbrough where the coaches of the Stockton Wheelers put the students through their paces.
