Learning is best when students are inspired. Inspiration at Teesdale School takes many forms, from exciting and imaginative teaching and learning to extra-curricular opportunities in sport and the arts, international visits and exchanges and prestigious internships. There is a comprehensive

package of enrichment activities which encourage students to broaden their horizons and aim high.

Moreover, we expect our young people to inspire others as prefects, role models or maybe even as head boy or head girl.

Working TOGETHER

Our school community is built on collaboration. Older students mentor younger ones, fostering an ethos of peer support and guidance. Parents and carers are delighted at how quickly this helps Year 7 students integrate into the school and feel at home.

Our traditional house system nurtures a sense of identity and belonging and encourages healthy competition amongst students. The houses, Austen,

Maxwell, Shakespeare, Franklin and Richardson are also involved in charity work, enabling students to develop compassion and responsibility and further engage with their local community.

We also work closely with local primary schools to ensure that all children are supported with transition into secondary school through one-to-one visits and close links with our primary transition coordinator.

Celebrating ACHIEVEMENT

Celebration at Teesdale School means encouraging students to value themselves and each other. Lapel badges are awarded for excellent achievement within subjects and Laurea Certificates can be

achieved for hard work and effort. Celebration assemblies are also held to reward engagement in learning and fulfilling our high expectations of attendance, behaviour and conduct.

Students at Teesdale have the opportunity to excel academically as well as fulfilling their potential in sport, music and the arts. A strong emphasis on achievement, balanced with opportunities to participate in our competitive rugby, cricket and football teams and outstanding shows, inspires students to aim high.

Exam results

This year we once again saw strong GCSE and A level results. Year-on-year our exam results are consistently high and we are placed amongst the top performing schools in the area.

Able and talented

High performing students are given every opportunity to achieve the very top results through increased challenge and access to higher learning opportunities.

These include collaborations with local academics, debating, after school clubs and unique enrichment activities including a recent visit to the European Parliament, a fully funded cross-curricular project in Martinique (Caribbean island), the annual Poetry by Heart competition and our Carnegie Medal literature prize club.

International connections

Our International School Award is a public recognition of the many ways our school reaches out to students of different cultures. It also represents our commitment to ensuring our students can take their place in the world as global citizens.

Our international focus gives children unique opportunities to connect with their peers in other countries quite literally expanding their horizons and worldview. Our students visited Paris this year and have taken part in a project with a school in Kenya in conjunction with Northumbria University. Next year, Rome and the First World War battlefields of Belgium and Northern France are on the horizon.

Creative license

Our students thrive on the creative opportunities our artistic teachers offer them. From taking part in our annual plays and shows to musical tuition, choir, school bands, art, computing and DT clubs, students here have every opportunity to enthusiastically dance, act, sing, play, draw, paint, photograph, design, cook, and stitch their way to success. This year students showcased their talents in a fantastic production of Sister Act and catered for over 60 guests in our Christmas pop-up restaurant.

Sporting success

At Teesdale School being active comes naturally to our young sportsmen and women with their

dedication and enthusiasm often translating into silverware. Some recent highlights include County Champions for discus and shot, as well as a silver medal in the 300m, three students represented the region at a Northern Counties Competition. We are also south-west Durham rounders champions.

One of our Key Stage 3 students competed in the Ilca 4 sailing competition and secured a place on the Great Britain development team heading to Portugal. Matthew Brennan, in Year 13, recently broke the junior individual pursuit world record and won a silver medal at the European Cycling Championships. He will now be taking up a spot on the professional Jumbo-Visma team.

With a team of excellent specialist staff a rigorous approach to high quality learning takes place in all classrooms. Teesdale School is part of the North East Learning Trust (NELT), a successful family of 12 schools across the North East.

NELT has a proven track record of school improvement with all schools under their wing having sustained or improved their Ofsted gradings at their first inspection following sponsorship.

NELT is widely regarded as providing some of the best education in the county, and indeed the country, with children making significant progress from their starting points, achieving impressive exam results, and going on to access a range of well-respected further and higher education opportunities including courses at some of the UK's most elite universities.

The Trust is also heavily involved with teacher development. It boasts its very own teacher training arm, North East SCITT, that trains the next generation of teachers and ensures the highest standards of teaching are instilled from the outset.

Pastoral support

Our high quality pastoral provision is pivotal in ensuring that all students are well supported and able to learn. We focus on developing resilience, confidence and providing high quality personal development for every child through a wide network of staff support including tutors, heads of year, key stage directors and our special educational needs coordinator. We also have our Laurea Centre, which is dedicated to providing targeted support and intervention that includes a counsellor on site for one day a week to support individuals and groups of students.

From time to time, everyone needs a helping hand. At Teesdale School we have a highly experienced

pastoral team and support system that gives every student access to care, advice and guidance when they need it. From extra academic support, to dealing with any worries or personal problems, we have the right people in place to help every child through difficult times.

Community spirit

We are proud to have a strong connection with our local Rotary Club and we have received a prestigious presidential citation from Rotary International for students' work in supporting local community events and raising money for projects in the developing world.
