Physiotherapist

Physiotherapists help patients with physical difficulties resulting from illness, injury, disability or ageing to restore and maximise their movement and reduce the risk of further problems arising in the future.

Qualifications:

- ✓ minimum of five GCSE passes at level 4 or above, including Maths, English language and Sciences.
- ✓ two or three good A-levels (or equivalent), including a biological Science (Biology or Human Biology) and/or PE.
- ✓ either an undergraduate or an accelerated postgraduate degree course in physiotherapy

Working hours: Physiotherapists typically work 37.5 hours a week, which may include evenings, nights and weekends.

Salary: Starting salaries for qualified physiotherapists range from £24,907 to £30,615. Senior physiotherapists can earn between £31,365 and £37,890.

Labour market information

The two industries supplying the highest employee jobs in the North East are:

- The Wholesale And Retail Trade; Repair Of Motor Vehicles And Motorcycles
- Human Health And Social Work Activities - This section includes a wide range of activities such as: health care provided by trained medical professionals in hospitals and other facilities, residential care workers and social work.

What is Careers Education?

Careers education is a requirement within schools, set by the Department for Education. The information gained from this education allows students to prepare for the workplace, know what careers are available to them, plan what routes to get in to careers and gain skills needed in the work place.

What is labour market information?
